## KS1

### Year One and Two

Over the past half term, KS1 have managed to squeeze in so much fun and learning! We have continued our learning journey 'Simply the Best!' where the children have been learning about the Olympics in history and mapping journeys and using a compass in geography. In art we have been mixing colours and exploring repeat patterns using Asian patterns to inspire us!

In Y1 English we had the notorious Evil Pea cause chaos in our classroom! We managed to use our detective and descriptions skills to capture the culprit and interview him for our newspaper report to help warn others! Y2 have enjoyed reading Mad Iris, they have re written their own versions of the story using new characters!

We even managed to squeeze in a trip to Duncombe Park where we spent the whole day outdoors, we re-enacted the battle of Hastings, learnt to milk cows, measured trees and searched for microorganisms!

We have had a jam packed last week of the year, filled with fun sports the children have had so much fun trying new things and we wish them all a very lovely summer holidays!



### YEAR 3

In literacy, we have been focusing on reading non-fiction texts linking to our current curriculum focus 'Rainforest Rescue' the children have loved reading all about rainforests, especially a real life story about Buddy the orangutan who lost his home due to deforestation! The children have written some brilliant pieces of writing using this knowledge. They wrote a persuasive leaflet to help save rainforests, using the internet to research their own facts and figures to support their points. They then went on to write a diary entry pretending to be a child living in the rainforest. These made a very interesting read! In maths, we have been looking at statistics. The children have been collecting data and presenting it into a pictogram or bar chart. They have all done fantastically at this and loved it!

Our curriculum focus has been 'Rainforest Rescue' the children have showed so much enthusiasm and enjoyment during this. From learning about where our rainforests are, who lives there, the names of the layers, why rainforests are under threat to how we can save them. The children have loved every lesson! They are rainforest rescuers now!

This half term we were lucky enough to go on an exciting trip to Waterfall Farm! The children loved this experience of meeting all the lovely animals and seeing what life on the farm is like. Many children overcame their fears by

getting up close to animals and even feeding them! We were also given the amazing opportunity of being able to make our very own sausages!

As the year ends, we have reflected on all the fun we have had together and the memories we have made! These children will be missed by Miss Shepherd a lot but she said she will make sure she pops in to see them throughout their time at TCP! Have a wonderful summer!





## Year 4

What an amazing summer term Year 4 has had!

In math, we have been looking at position and direction, statistics and time. The children are getting much more confident now with time and working out when break, lunch and home time is. During our English lessons, we have been writing our own biographies. We collectively wrote one about Jane Goodall, a famous explorer who worked with chimpanzees and then the children chose their own and made lapbooks with all the important information. They all look so colourful and the children worked hard on them.

In the afternoon, we continued our rainforest rescue theme but focused more on the deforestation of the Amazon and how this affects living things there and also around the world. We looked at companies who contribute to this and what others are doing to prevent the problems. The children were fantastic and had really great discussions about this issue. We also looked at food chains in science and created our own.

Outside of the classroom, the children enjoyed their trip to Waterfall Farm. It was so lovely to see them outdoors and enjoying nature and how gentle and caring they were with the animals. They fed goats and their babies, gave bottles to the lambs, held the baby chicks and walked round the pigs before joining in with some team building games and activities. They ended the day by making their own sausages – about 70, which we enjoyed this week. During our enrichment week the children enjoyed Olympic dancing, skipping, climbing wall, athletics, wheelchair basketball, skateboarding and even yoga meditation. We finished our swimming sessions with a 30-minute fun session. It was fantastic to see the children learn new skills, grow in confidence and even move up levels.



## YEAR 5

We have had a very busy half term. In maths we have done lots of work with shape and measurements. We have read Clockwork, which most of the children enjoyed! I have read Percy Jackson to them, and they have enjoyed using their knowledge of the ancient Greeks to understand the story.

We have done lots of work around the Olympics– both modern day and Ancient Greek. The children researched their own facts and wrote a comparison information text which were all fantastic to read.

We had a thoroughly enjoyable day at the high school for our enrichment day, the children were all so well behaved, worked really hard and made me very proud indeed!!!

PE enrichment week has been so much fun, Year 5 especially loved the climbing wall and Wheelchair basket ball– these were firm favourites.

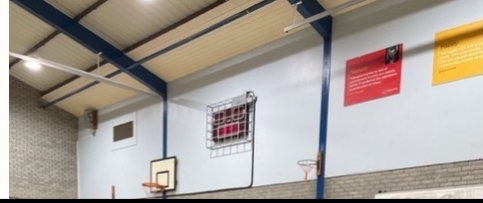
## YEAR 6
