NIRSERY and RECEPTION

The children this half term have learnt all about celebrations with the theme being, 'Boom, boom, boom!'. This started with Bonfire Night, then led to Diwali, and finally Christmas! Focus books have supported the children learning about similarities and differences between families, communities, and faiths. Whilst reading the books the adults have introduced and used the Wow Words; Bright, Fade, Belief/ Believe, Tradition, Celebration and Gift. This vocabulary has been further supported by activities within provision. During art enrichment week the children designed and made their own Christmas bauble. This idea came from a circle time discussion based on the word tradition. The children discovered that the families of the Hive have different traditions at Christmas, but that most families put baubles on their tree! In Maths they also learnt that 16 of our EYFS children have a star at the top of their tree, 5 children have angels, 3 have a bow, and 1 family has a magic fairy!

<u>KS1</u> Year 1 and 2

Over this last term, children have continued with the theme 'Come fly with me'. Where we have been investigating weather, our local area, country and continent, and the history of flight. Year 2 students have written reports on our local area, and a biography for Amelia Earhart. Year 1 have been working extremely hard in maths, learning their number bonds to ten and all about 2D and 3D shapes.

KS1 have been working hard over the last few weeks on our nativity Whoops-A-Daisy Angel and have completed three outstanding shows to the school, parents and carers!

During arts week, children had the opportunity to partake in a drama workshop and watch a show presented by Thirsk High students, they thoroughly enjoyed the workshop and got really stuck in! A lot of KS1 are destined for the stage!!!

In DT children designed, created and evaluated their own junk model planes, they had lots of fun and discussed and shared some wonderful ideas.



Year 3 and 4

What a jam packed half term Yr 3 and 4 have had!! They started the term off with a terrific trip to the National Railway Museum in York to delve deeper into the world of locomotives - enjoying the chance to see some of the most famous ones up close. Using their experiences, they then went on to produce some wonderful recounts of the visit as well as writing persuasively to encourage new tourists to visit in the future. Within their history, geography and PSHE, the children looked to the future of locomotives - focusing upon how locomotives of the future will impact their environment and community. There was a real focus upon safety around railways and the children considered ways to keep themselves and others safe around tracks and stations.

As part of their arts enrichment week, Year 3 and 4 kicked off their art activities with a Christmas " crafternoon" and spent time with family members getting all Christmassy making all manner of crafts from sock snowmen to paper wreaths and snowflakes. It certainly got them in the mood for all the festivities! They then took another trip out, this time to Thirsk Hall, to see the sculptures within the gardens and focused upon the materials and themes of each sculpture - it was a wonderful winter's walk around Thirsk Hall's grounds. Their biggest project across arts week was the designing and making of their Christmas lightboxes, which required the children to use the design process of plan, make and review. They worked incredibly hard all week from sawing and gluing the wood to designing their Christmas picture for the front. Everyone was super proud and delighted with their end product. Hopefully they have pride of place in their homes!

The last couple of weeks have been spent practising the Christmas songs ready for the church carol service and writing instructions for other budding DT enthusiasts, who might like to make a lightbox of their own. After all their hard work they will be ready for a well earnt rest over the school holidays - ready to start again in the new year!

Year 5 and 6

What a busy half term Year 5 and 6 have had! We started the half term with an art project, which looked at retro-futuristic artwork. All of the children produced some brilliant pieces throughout the week. Year 5 also used this to write a set of instructions about how to produce this art in English. We have also completed a DT project, where we made motorised Mars Rovers. The children looked at the existing Mars rover's features along with the conditions on Mars to design their own. We then built these and tested them!

In maths, Year 6 have been focussing on securing written methods for the four operations, including long multiplication and long division. In English, we have loved discussing our new non -fiction text - "In a galaxy of her own" - which contains a series of biographies about incredible female astronauts, engineer and scientists. From this, we have written our own podcasts, and debated the future of space exploration.

Year 5 have been reading 'The Cosmic Diary of our Incredible Universe', which was written by the astronaut, Tim Peake. We have used this to think about the positives and negatives of space exploration and wrote fantastic balanced arguments. In Maths, Year 5 have been focusing on Fractions, where we have learnt to add and subtract fractions with different denominators.
