

Key Stage 1 Reading Assembly (Picture book) Key stage 2 Reading Assembly (Chapter book)


#### Thirsk Pop-up Library

It's opening night of the Winter Games, but all is not well in the United Woodlands. Top animal athletes are disappearing, and there are whispers of a beast on the prowl!




#### <u>Kitty</u>
