On a separate note, please ensure that the school has up to date contact numbers for your child. In the event of an emergency we need to be able to get hold of parents/ carers. Failure to provide contact details can put your child at risk and could be considered a safeguarding concern.

### Year 1 and 2 News

#### Year 1 Sutton

This half term we have been busy working on numbers up to 50. Understanding tens and ones, ordering the numbers and knowing which are bigger and smaller. We have continued to work on our 5- and 3-times tables on TTRS, improving our recall of multiplication and even division. In English we have increased our independence. Writing about the three little pigs, trying to sell their houses by describing the indoors and outdoors. We are continuing to set high expectation of writing on the line, using finger spaces alongside of capital letters and full stops. We are now increasing the use of adjectives to allow the reader to create a more detailed picture in their mind.

#### Y2 Roseberry

This half term our topic has been 'Marvellous Materials'. We have explored the properties of everyday materials and we have investigated what happens to materials when we squash, stretch, bend and mould them. We had lots of fun selecting appropriate materials to design and make boats. In Literacy we have loved reading the novel 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. We made our own magic medicines and then predicted what would happen if Grandma tasted our medicines. We wrote our own versions of the story which were so fabulously creative! In Maths we have continued our hard work with arithmetic. We've been practising adding and subtracting 2 two-digit numbers, multiplying and dividing amounts and finding fractions of amounts. We've also been learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. We have been identifying vertices, faces, sides and edges. Well done Y2! What a fabulous bunch!

### Year 3 and 4

Year 3 have had a brilliant half term and have all been working very hard! In Maths, we have looked at fractions, money and measuring in mm, cm and m. In English, we have read two books, Louis Loudmouth and The Iron Man, which the children have thoroughly enjoyed! We have used these texts to write a diary entry, a wanted poster and a letter. We also spent a week writing our stories for World Book Day, where the children imagined they were on a broken ship and landed somewhere exciting! It was lovely to see all the children so enthusiastic about writing and produce such fantastic stories!

In Year 4 Maths, we have covered multiplication and division, fractions and decimals! We have read a range of texts, both fictions, non-fiction and poetry! The Boy Who Made the World Disappear has quickly become a class favourite, and the children wrote their own book based on this for World Book Day. We have also had a lot of fun reading and writing nonsense poetry, following rhyme patterns and creating our own nonsense language!

#### Miss Dalby

In Year 3 and 4, our topic this term has been Forces and Magnets. In this, we have completed lots of experiments to find out what is magnetic and what magnets were the strongest. In Art this term, we have looked at the work of Antony Gormley and the children have had a go at sketching some of his work, such as the Angel of The North and the Iron Man. We have also spent time in PSHE looking at how we can keep ourselves safe when playing online and outside and identifying potential risks.

#### Years 5 & Year 6 News

This term our topic has been 'Light'. We have explored the structure of the eye, and researched the functions of all the different parts. We then looked at how we see, by exploring the processes of reflection and refraction. In this, we have done some brilliant investigations: we loved spying on the other classes using our periscopes, and enjoyed making pictures disappear under a glass of water using the magic of refraction! We linked this to our work in art, by producing incredible detailed drawings of the eye.



HOLIDAY clubs are taking place this Easter which will provide children with nutritious food and a chance to take part in exciting and engaging activities to improve health and wellbeing.

The FEAST programme is now in its third year and sees holiday activities including sports, outdoor activities and creative workshops taking place in each North Yorkshire district over the school Easter break.

Activities are open to all children and young people in North Yorkshire. Furthermore, children and young people who receive benefitsrelated free school meals can attend for free and will also receive a hot meal or packed lunch each day. Eligible families will receive a letter with a code to claim their free place via their school.

The FEAST programme is run by North Yorkshire Together, a partnership between North Yorkshire Youth, North Yorkshire Sport and Rural Arts that supports residents to be happy and healthy.

North Yorkshire County Council received funding to coordinate healthy holiday activities for children from the Department for Education's Holiday Activities and Food programme. The funding recognises that school holidays can put additional pressures on family finances due to increased food and childcare costs and aims to provide children with activities which help them stay healthy, active and socially connected and allow them to develop new skills.

Many of the activities are accessible for families of children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND.)
